Thank you and well done to everyone who responded to the County Council's consultation on Short Breaks funding and potential cuts to our budget in June last year- apparently the Council received the best response EVER!

Your valuable feedback was listened to.

The good news: We now have a 5 year Short Breaks contract with Oxfordshire County Council, which is a huge relief!

The bad news: Our budget has been cut by £31,000 per year which, although not great, is much better than we feared!

Here's an update, and the impact on what we provide:

Family support work We now receive only 68% of the costs for our two family support workers, Becky and Sam. But don't worry! We are committed to carry on regardless, and will need to raise £34,000 every year to sustain this service. Please see below for how you could help. Youth Groups We are delighted that our Saturday Youth Group and STUFF Youth Group will continue to be funded by Short Breaks for the next 5 years.	We also run 2 other youth groups - Friday and Wednesday Youth Groups. These are funded separately and we need to continuously fundraise.	More of the 'F' word Fundraising!!

Overall it's positive – the new five year contract with Oxfordshire County Council gives us much needed stability to keep going strong, and to **GROW**! In our recent Annual Evaluation you told us you want **MORE** - more **family support workers**, more **training**, and more **activities**.

We're also initiating our vision for a *Centre for Autism* – a place for information, support, friendships, and ideas!

This Summer includes your favourite activities as well as some **NEW activities!**

This year laser storm at Carterton, has a new twist with a visit to nearby Crocodiles! There are old favourites such as gaming at The Mish along with an evening to Party @ The Mish. For those who want some outdoor adventure we have 2 days at The Earth Trust, with a survival day and a wild life day, in addition to our regular visit to Farmer Gows. If you like to be creative we have 2 days making animation, and are introducing some craft activities to our Mish gaming days. For those who love speed we have indoor go-karting too.

- The stated arrival/drop off time is when registration will begin. Our staff become responsible for young people after registration - if you arrive early please supervise your child and wait to
- All children must have already been referred to us and live in Oxfordshire.

- Final confirmation of places will be sent AFTER the closing date on Monday 26th June
- If you have gueries or special arrangements regarding payment please let us know as soon as possible.
- IMPORTANT note about MEDICATION If whilst attending our activities your child will need any medication which may require action/intervention/storage by our staff, e.g. Diabetes, medication for ADHD, epilepsy, please let us know ASAP so we can organise staff training. Attendance will not be permitted if our staff are unable to receive training in good time, or we were not made aware of medical needs.

The Closing Date for applications is Monday 26th June 2017 - Please BOOK EARLY as Activities are usually fully booked! We prioritise early bookings as much as possible.
